CCHCC Campaigns and Programs

Issue Campaigns and Task Forces

The ACA and Medicaid Defense Campaign began in December 2016. CCHCC is organizing and advocating to protect the Affordable Care Act and the Medicaid program from legislative and administrative efforts to repeal or dismantle the ACA and drastically cut funding for the Medicaid program.

The 5th & Hill Neighborhood Rights Campaign, started in 2007, is an environmental justice campaign dedicated to protecting the health of the neighborhood residents and the rights of the community in relation to the former manufactured gas plant toxic site owned by Ameren, located at 5th and Hill Streets in Champaign. CCHCC is organizing this campaign in collaboration with neighborhood residents and former residents. The Campaign is currently focused on trying to make the IL EPA and Ameren expand the area of investigation and clean-up of all toxic contamination that resulted from the operation of the former manufactured gas plant.

The Medicare Task Force was formed in 2005 by Medicare beneficiaries working for legislative reform to improve the Medicare Part D prescription drug program. The Task Force is currently working to protect and strengthen crucial federal and state programs for seniors and people with disabilities, including Medicare, Social Security, and Medicaid. The Task Force provides a forum for local Medicare beneficiaries to discuss the issues affecting them and learn about services that are available in our community. The Task Force meets on the third Thursday of each month at 11:30 a.m. at the Champaign Public Library.

Service Programs

The ACA Enrollment Program was established in October 2013. CCHCC staff serve as Certified Applications Counselors and provide in-person assistance to community members who need to enroll in insurance coverage and financial assistance made available by the Affordable Care Act. This assistance includes enrollment into programs like Medicaid and Medicaid Managed Care, as well as private insurance options through the Health Insurance Marketplace at healthcare.gov.

The Consumer Health Hotline, established in 1980, is a free service to help people who are having problems with the health care system and who need access to affordable health care. CCHCC's Community Health Worker (CHW) staff help community members get the health care and other services they need. CHWs provide information, referral, assistance, advocacy and case management services to hundreds of community members each month.

The Dental Referral Program was created in 1992 to provide low income, uninsured adults with access to quality, affordable dental care. The Dental Referral Program – a collaboration with area dentists – provides dental care at a discounted rate to low-income adults in our community.

The Medicare 100/Plus Program, created in 1984, assures access to affordable health care for low-income Medicare beneficiaries in Champaign County. This community-based program is a collaboration between CCHCC and OSF Heart of Mary Medical Center. The Medicare 100/Plus Program bridges the gap between health care costs and what Medicare reimburses by providing Medicare 100/Plus members with discounts on their out-of-pocket Medicare related charges at OSF Heart of Mary hospital and certain physician practices.

It was quite some time ago that I first walked down John Lee Johnson Way in the North End. During my years with the 5th and Hill Neighborhood Rights Campaign, I came to know that name well. People would tell me the stories about how Mr. Johnson helped people in the neighborhood. They would tell me the stories about how he brought people together. And they would tell me that the work that we were doing together reminded them of him.

These days I find myself teaching this kind of work to a younger generation. And I get to tell them the stories about how you helped people and brought them together. When I do this, I have the good fortune of remembering all you have taught me. In so many of these memories, we are all sitting around Mr. Pelmore's dining room table talking about the work we must do and giving each other strength. Being with you around that table I learned so many lessons, but one stands out above all others. I am so grateful that you shared both of those gifts with me because it has filled my life with purpose and pleasure. I learned the work of community organizing by doing that work with you. The spirit of your work on the 5th and Hill Neighborhood Rights Campaign is forever present in my life, just as it is forever a part of the North End's proud history of standing up for justice.

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
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
