### <u>Welcome</u>

This year's Annual Awards Dinner takes on special significance as we celebrate the 40th Anniversary of Champaign County Health Care Consumers (CCHCC). Founded in 1977 as a vehicle to empower consumers concerned about the health care system, CCHCC has grown from a handful of local residents into one of the largest, most effective, local consumer health advocacy organizations in the nation. CCHCC has become a

nationally recognized model for effective grassroots organizing for health care justice and access.

From its inception, CCHCC has been committed to improving the health care system by making it more responsive to consumer needs. Our work has helped transform our community, and as we reflect on 40 years of grassroots organizing, we are proudest of our initiatives that have resulted in the creation of new programs in our community, including: midwifery services; prenatal care programs; school breakfast programs for low-income children; the Medicare 100 and Plus Program for low-income Medicare beneficiaries (a collaboration with Presence Covenant Medical Center); the county-wide public health department; greatly improved financial assistance programs at our local hospitals; free dental care for low-income county children; the SmileHealthy dental program; discounted dental care for low-income adults; the 5th & Hill Neighborhood Rights Campaign to force Ameren to clean-up its toxic site in the neighborhood; and helping to halt toxic waste dumping in a landfill above the Mahomet Aquifer, to name a few of the lasting legacies that CCHCC has contributed to our community.

Our success at the local level has generated state and national recognition, expanding the organization's reputation and influence. CCHCC has repeatedly spearheaded statewide campaigns and sparked and shaped national initiatives.

Even as we have worked to make concrete improvements in people's lives, changing health and environmental policy from the ground up, the real measure of our success is found in the tremendous support we have received from the thousands of local consumers who actively support and participate in the organization, and from the many organizations, including local government entities, with whom we collaborate to improve the health of our community.

### **CCHCC Campaigns and Programs**

#### **Issue Campaigns and Task Forces**

The ACA and Medicaid Defense Campaign began in December 2016. CCHCC is organizing and advocating to protect the Affordable Care Act and the Medicaid program from legislative efforts to repeal the ACA and drastically cut funding for the entire Medicaid program through block grants or caps.

The 5th & Hill Neighborhood Rights Campaign, started in 2007, is an environmental justice campaign dedicated to protecting the health of the neighborhood residents and the rights of the community in relation to the former manufactured gas plant toxic site owned by Ameren, located at 5th and Hill Streets in Champaign. CCHCC is organizing this campaign in collaboration with neighborhood residents and former residents. The Campaign is currently focused on trying to make the IL EPA and Ameren expand the area of investigation in order to identify all toxic contamination that resulted from the operation of the former manufactured gas plant.

The Medicare Task Force was formed in 2005 by Medicare beneficiaries working for legislative reform to improve the Medicare Part D prescription drug program. The Task Force is currently working to protect and strengthen crucial federal and state programs for seniors and people with disabilities, including Medicare, Social Security, and Medicaid. The Task Force provides a forum for local Medicare beneficiaries to discuss the issues affecting them and learn about services that are available in our community. The Task Force meets on the third Thursday of each month at 11:30 a.m. at the Champaign Public Library.

#### **Service Programs**

The ACA Enrollment Program was established in October 2013. CCHCC staff serve as Certified Applications Counselors and provide in-person assistance to community members who need to enroll in insurance coverage and financial assistance made available by the Affordable Care Act. This assistance includes enrollment into programs like Medicaid as well as private insurance options through the Health Insurance Marketplace at healthcare.gov.

The Consumer Health Hotline, established in 1980, is a free service to help people who are having problems with the health care system and who need access to affordable health care. CCHCC's Community Health Worker (CHW) staff help community members get the health care and other services they need. CHWs provides information, referral, assistance, advocacy and case management services to hundreds of community members each month.

**The Dental Referral Program** was created in 1992 to provide low income, uninsured adults with access to quality, affordable dental care. The Dental Referral Program – a collaboration with area dentists – provides dental care at a discounted rate to low-income adults in our community.

The Medicare 100/Plus Program, created in 1984, assures access to affordable health care for low-income Medicare beneficiaries in Champaign County. This community-based program is a collaboration between CCHCC and Presence Covenant Medical Center. The Medicare 100/Plus Program bridges the gap between health care costs and what Medicare reimburses by providing Medicare 100/Plus members with discounts on their out-of-pocket Medicare related charges at Presence Covenant hospital and certain physician practices.

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
# Do you have Medicare <u>and</u> go to Presence Covenant Medical Center?
