This is a list of low cost health care services in Champaign County. Please call the clinics for more information, as their hours of service and eligibility requirements may change. Champaign County Christian Health Center

Hours at Champaign Location: Tuesdays 5:30 - 8:30 p.m.; 2nd & 4th Wednesday of the month 5 - 7 p.m.

The Christian Health Center provides free primary care to uninsured adults. They also have referral slots to the Frances Nelson Health Center and other health care facilities to ensure patients receive follow-up care, if needed. Some of the services include physicals for both adults and children, and screenings for high blood pressure, diabetes, and cholesterol. The CCHCC also provides limited dental care and mental health services, however, patients must schedule a medical appointment prior to receiving those services.

Avicenna Community Health Center opened its doors in January 2010 to provide free care to uninsured people in our community. Avicenna currently provides blood pressure and glucose screenings, one-on-one consultations with a physician, direct referrals to local facilities, and diet and nutrition information.

Love Clinic

Walk-in hours (no appointment needed): On the last Saturday of every month from 9 a.m. - 12 p.m.

The Love Clinic, organized by the Church of the Living God, provides physicals, emergency prescription refills (you must bring your bottles), cholesterol screenings, and other services. They also provide emergency prescription assistance up to an amount of \$25.

HeRMES Clinic

Hermes Clinic is a student-run free clinic with partnerships in the Champaign Urbana area. They are a walk in clinic so there is no need to schedule an appointment. They can provide assistance with physicals, diagnosis, treatment or referrals when appropriate, and medical lab tests. Frances Nelson Health Center provides primary medical services, a prenatal care, counseling, immunizations and others services. Payment is accepted on a sliding scale from uninsured patients who provide proof of income. Frances Nelson also accepts Medicaid. Patients can receive assistance to apply for Medicaid. **If you need help with dental care, the SmileHealthy Dental Center provides primary dental care, including**

cleanings, exams, x-rays, fillings, and extractions. You can call the Dental Center to make an appointment at (217) 403-5477.
