



Low Cost Hearing Aid Resources

The price range of hearing aids is wide: anywhere from \$1,500 to more than \$4,000 per hearing aid. Finding affordable hearing aids in our area can be a challenge. Champaign County Health Care Consumers (CCHCC) has compiled a list of low-cost hearing aid resources in the Champaign County area. If you have any questions about the options listed below, or for more information, please feel free to contact a CCHCC Community Health Worker at (217) 352-6533.

Medicaid (IL medical card) covers hearing aid related testing, counseling, fitting, as well as the sale of hearing aids and their parts. Original Medicare and supplement/Medigap plans do not cover hearing aids. A few Medicare Advantage plans offer limited coverage. For those not on Medicare, some private insurance plans may offer coverage. Check with your insurance plan to see if they offer hearing aid coverage and where you can go for services.

AUDIENT services people who earn up to 250% of the poverty line (\$29,425 per year for a single person household). Qualified families and seniors will pay \$760 - \$1,400 for one hearing aid, or \$1,290 - \$2,400 for two hearing aids. The fee also includes a fitting, three follow-up visits or adjustments, ear molds, and a manufacturer's warranty of 1 or 2 years. It does not include a hearing evaluation. AUDIENT providers exist locally in Champaign, Decatur, and Normal. To apply, contact CCHCC or download an application.

The Lions of Illinois Used Hearing Aid Bank (HAB) provides financial assistance and used hearing aids to needy individuals who cannot afford to purchase a hearing aid or do not qualify to receive an aid from the State agencies. Anyone with an Illinois address is eligible to apply and the extent of services provided are determined on a case-by-case basis. An application may be obtained from CCHCC or the Lions of Illinois Foundation. Lions Clubs in central Illinois are located in Champaign, Mattoon, Springfield, and others.

AARP members are eligible to receive hearing aid benefits through their Hearing Care Program. Membership costs \$16 a year, Benefits include 20% savings on a wide range of digital hearing aids, 3-year manufacturer warranty, and a 3-year supply of hearing aid batteries of \$100 value. The closest network provider is located in Danville. Visit AARP.org to become a member.

Starkey Hearing Foundation's Hear Now Program and the **Foundation for Sight and Sound's Help America Hear Program** also provides financial assistance. However, they require applicants to have exhausted all other resources, including insurance, state Medicaid programs, family support, vocational rehabilitation, school districts, VA, church groups, and state or local programs. Carle offers financial assistance through the Community Care Discount Program. If a patient is 100% eligible, Community Care may cover 1 hearing aid for patients who have bilateral hearing loss of 50dB or greater in both ears. They accept Medicaid. To see if you qualify for Community Care, and to get assistance in applying, contact CCHCC Community Health Workers.

The Audiology Clinic offers free hearing screening appointments. The fee for a hearing test includes a free hearing aid consultation and a hearing aid demonstration. Hearing aid recommendations are made based on three levels of technology and price levels. Patients are seen frequently during their 6 week hearing aid trial period so hearing aid adjustments can occur. The Audiology Clinic works with three hearing aid companies.

Your first appointment is free and includes a comprehensive hearing evaluation. They carry a limited supply of refurbished hearing aids and offer payment plans through Wells Fargo starting at 0% for 24 months. They do not accept Medicaid.
