

# Reproductive Health Care Services in the Champaign County Area

Champaign County Health Care Consumers has created this guide to inform women and men about local and state programs that can help them gain access to STD testing, family planning services, reproductive health screenings, and contraception.

## Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer Program (IBCCP) 1-888-522-3326 (toll free) or 1-800-547-0466 (TTY) cancerscreening.illinois.gov

The Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer Program is a program of the Illinois Department of Public Health that provides free mammograms, breast exams, pelvic exams, and pap tests to uninsured women. Women that are enrolled in the IBCC Program and are diagnosed with cancer can receive treatment coverage. Women who are already diagnosed and need treatment may enroll in the IBCC Program to cover the cost of their treatment.

#### You are eligible for the Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer Program if:

- You are uninsured.
- You live in Illinois.
- You are between 35 and 64 years old.\*
  \*Younger women may be eligible if they are experiencing symptoms.

To apply for the Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer Program, women can call 1-888-522-3326 (1-800-547-0466 TTY) to enroll over the phone. They may also call the Champaign-Urbana Public Health District, our local IBCCP agency, at (217) 373-9281 to get enrolled.

Individuals that are 12 and older can receive STD (sexually transmitted disease) testing for chancroid, chlamydia, genital herpes, gonorrhea, hepatitis, herpes, HIV (human immunodeficiency virus), and syphilis at the C-UPHD STD Clinic. Testing is confidential and parental permission is not needed. You do not need to be a Champaign County resident or a U.S. citizen to receive testing.

The Champaign-Urbana Public Health District also provides pap tests, pregnancy tests, and can prescribe birth control to interested individuals.

No one is denied services because of their inability to pay, and low income individuals can pay at a discount or can receive free services if they are unable to pay the full amount.

To get tested, go to the C-UPHD STD Clinic at 201 W. Kenyon Road in Champaign during the open clinic hours. No appointment is necessary.

Clinic hours are Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

### Planned Parenthood Champaign Health Center 302 E. Stoughton Street in Champaign (217) 359-8022

The Planned Parenthood Champaign Health Center offers abortion services, birth control, STD and HIV testing, emergency contraception (the morning after pill), pregnancy testing, reproductive health screenings and exams, and treatment of urinary tract infections and vaginal infections for women. They also offer reproductive health checkups and vasectomies for men.

Planned Parenthood accepts Medicaid, Illinois Healthy Women, and some private insurance carriers. Planned Parenthood does <u>not</u> offer discounts or payment on a sliding scale for services, and reproductive health services must be paid for on the day of treatment.

Planned Parenthood Health Center hours are Monday through Wednesday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Thursday from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m., and Friday from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.
